To the Sir Knights of Texas:

To the Sir Knights of Texas I bring to you greetings from your Grand Commandery and its Grand Officers. I wish for each of you and your families a very happy Thanksgiving season. As I was perusing the Internet, Wikipedia gave to me some very useful information. Did you know that the very first Thanksgiving was celebrated on 8 September 1565 when 600 Spanish settlers in what is now St. Augustine celebrated a Mass of Thanksgiving for their safe voyage to the new world.

On 4 December 1619, thirty-eight English settlers arrived at Berkley Hundred, on the North bank of the James River in Virginia. Their Charter required that the day of arrival be celebrated yearly as a day of Thanksgiving. Thanksgiving in the early days seemed to alternate between strictly church services and Feast days.

As President, George Washington proclaimed on 3 October 1789 (paraphrased) that it was the duty of all Nations to acknowledge the providence of Almighty God, to obey his will and to be grateful for his benefits. He recommended that Thursday, 26 November next be set aside as a day of Thanksgiving.

The U.S. Congress, Passed a Bill requiring that the 4th Thursday in November be set aside as an official and legal Holliday to observe Thanksgiving. President Roosevelt signed this into Law on 26 December 1941. See Statute 862 (1941).
